God preserves His Word.

Where does Scripture identify *one future English edition*?

WHAT SCRIPTURE SAYS

“My words shall not pass away.”



Where is the connecting premise?

WHAT MUST BE PROVED

One exact KJV form is uniquely perfect.

The question is not whether God preserves.
It is how that conclusion is identified.

BEGIN WITH AGREEMENT

Preservation is biblical.

“The word of our God shall stand for ever.”

Isaiah 40:8, KJV

“My words shall not pass away.”

Matthew 24:35, KJV

Those promises are precious. Yet neither verse says which manuscripts, printed Greek edition, translation, revision, or typesetting will serve as the one final form for every English-speaking church.

1 Biblical premise: God preserves His Word.

2 Additional claim: providence uniquely identifies one exact KJV form.

? Needed: a biblical identification rule that does not assume its own conclusion.

A fair concession: reception, stability, textual continuity, and fruit may count as evidence. Christians who affirm all four still reach different preservation views.

BOTTOM LINE

A doctrine may use sound inference. But the inference must be shown from Scripture, not attached to Scripture after the fact.
