A better place to stand

Prefer the KJV if you wish. Defend the TR or Byzantine text if persuaded.
But do not make an extra test of faithfulness where Scripture does not.

BOTTOM LINE

Read the KJV. Love the KJV. Do not bind another Christian's conscience to a doctrine Scripture itself does not teach.
